Additional Privacy Notice for Reboot West

1625 Independent People promises to respect and protect any personal information you share with us or that we get from other organisations – and keep it safe.

When we collect information from you, we want you to be clear about what happens with it and what your rights are – we will not do anything with it that you wouldn't reasonably expect.

This notice is in addition to the information included in the 1625 Independent People privacy notice, which you can access online [here](#) or you can ask your Reboot Coach for a copy. We are providing this notice, so you are aware of some additional activities that are taking place for Reboot West only.

Sharing and disclosing your personal information

- The funders of Reboot, Youth Futures Foundation (YFF) have commissioned a third-party organisation called Behavioural Insights Team (BiT) to complete an evaluation of Reboot West on their behalf. The purpose of this evaluation is to understand the effectiveness of the project in supporting young people into employment.
- UK law requires us to have a legal basis to use information about you. There are 6 possible bases to choose from including getting your agreement or consent. We also need an extra legal basis to use "special categories" of information about you, such as information that relates to your health, like details of a disability. Again, there is a limited number of these extra bases that we can rely on. The legal basis we will be relying on for the majority of the information we use about you is that it is necessary to use your information to perform specific tasks in the public interest (helping young people leaving care) which is supported by a legal requirement (your local authority must support young people leaving care under UK law). But we will still ask for your permission to be part of Reboot and its evaluation so that you're not surprised or blindsided by what is happening with your information down the line.
- We will process the following types of information about you for the Programme:
 - Name
 - DOB
 - Equality and Diversity information (Gender/ethnicity etc)
 - If you are in education, employment, or training.

We will share your personal data with the Behavioural Insights Team (Bit) completing this evaluation to support their work. We will only disclose the minimum amount of information necessary for their purposes. For more information, please see the Behavioural Insights Team privacy notice – you have been provided with a copy of this. Behavioural Insights Team will match the data we share with them with additional data from public datasets, including Local Authority information.

We may also share your contact details with BiT for them to arrange an interview or a survey, should you wish to participate. The purpose of these activities will be to understand your experience of Reboot West.

At the end of this pilot, Behavioural Insights Team (BIT) will produce a report that will be shared with the programme's funder, the Youth Futures Foundation (YFF) and 1625 Independent People. This will not contain any information that could be used to identify you.

In addition to the above, some items of pseudo-anonymised personal data collected by LAs and 1625IP will be onwardly shared by BIT with YFF. Youth Futures are intending to hold these project data in a data repository (also referred to as a depository) and a data archive. The repository will contain smaller datasets, such as what would be collected from a pilot project, whereas the archive will be collecting data from larger-scale interventions, primarily where there is an opportunity to link to other datasets, including LEO (Longitudinal Educational Outcomes). These data are held on the legal basis of legitimate interests. To fulfil these purposes, the data may also be shared with other organisations who manage the archive, evaluate outcomes, conduct further research or link to data that is associated with Youth Futures' vision and values. Youth Futures will process data in accordance with data protection law which includes keeping it secure and only using it where there is a fair and lawful basis to do so.

Items shared with YFF by BIT will include:

- PMR/UPN
- Gender
- Postcode
- Month and year of birth
- Randomisation allocation
- Administrative data about participation in the programme
